# **Diocesan News**

## **Holy Land Fund**

This autumn the Diocese of Clogher will be engaged in several events, leading up to Christmas designed to raise money for the Holy Land Medical Relief Fund

During 2008/2009, almost hundred people visited the Holy Land on two pilgrimages organized from within the diocese of Clogher. Challenged forcibly bv humanitarian crisis which had unfolded in Gaza, people across the diocese generously supported the work of the Christian Al Ahli Hospital, where all who suffered injury in the hostilities were treated without discrimination.

The Holy Land Medical Relief Fund is an initiative which came about as a result of a direct request to me, as bishop, to suggest further ways in which to offer practical help to these beleaguered people. The fund seeks to support the deliverv development and medical services in the Holy Land, by supporting financially those

hospitals administered by our sister diocese, the diocese of Jerusalem. These hospitals are charitable and non-profit making. They receive no support from the government and their services are open to everyone.

There is now a committed group of individuals embarking on a fund raising initiative to raise \$100,000 towards the purchase of a C.T. (computer tomography) for St. Luke's Hospital, Nablus. (Since this written was an American organisation has come up with the funding for the CT scanner so the Clogher committee have decided to provide the money for other equipment needed at the hospital.) We are seeking your support in this urgent work of practical strategic development of services which we, in our own situation, would regard as essential and, dare we say it, an automatic entitlement.
