recently ioined **CMS** Concern and is now responsible for supporting the re-emerging church in war damaged southern Sudan, gave us the background theory about how, rather than sending long term expatriate missionaries, the focus is now on supporting local churches Africa in the projects they see to be necessary, sending short term people with financial support to help them achieve the local goals. He encouraged us to think about helping the local Anglicans in southern Sudan set up a series of health clinics.

In Magheracloone Roger Gough who joined CMS at the beginning of the year from Inter-serve and is now responsible for contacts with the church in India, Nepal and so on outlined a similar situation to David and spoke about a remarkable organisation disabled people in Nepal founded and being run by someone who is himself disabled and who CMS is now supporting. A group of Irish

people will be going to Nepal next | Canon Atkinson year to visit this project and perhaps get themselves and their churches home at directly involved in this project. Against background of what the happening in our own health service It was interesting to hear that some governments in Africa and Asia are asking Christian organisations. where Christians are in a minority, to take over the running of state hospitals as they cannot trust anyone else to run them.

So we look forward to what USPG will have to say to us and we hope that there will be good support for this service from all the churches in the area

## **Bishop's Synod Address**

Speaking at the Diocesan Synod on the 4<sup>th</sup> October in Clabby Bishop Jackson referred to ordained ministry in the diocese. He said: 'The Reverend Alison Seymour-Whiteley was ordained deacon on May 31st in St Macartan' Cathedral, Clogher. Likewise in Clogher Cathedral on June 9th the Reverend Elizabeth Thompson was ordained priest –

to a rather convincing local drumbeat which was more than a match for the technique shown by the archbishop of York when he was with us in 2006 if those of you who were present recall! These tremendously joyous were occasions in the lives of these two individuals, their families and in the on-going life of the diocese in both mission and ministry.
